The Showdown then took place throughout the day, showcasing individual skills in each camper's choice of activity, such as a soccer shootout, cup-stacking, tennis, and archery. In addition, campers competed in The Splash at the pools. These events featured freestyle races, noodle and paddleboat races, rubber duck races, and kickboard relays.

Thursday's events continued with another staff "Face-off," this time with head counselors competing for their respective teams. We laughed and we cheered: there was an Olympic air sport being judged, watermelon-eating with no hands, a three-legged race, "George Coleman bus-directing 'dance' moves," plus so much more! Pioneers had wacky relay races while Scouts, Explorers, and 49ers competed in The Stampede (track and field). The Hoedown began the series of culminating activities that comprise Closing Ceremonies. This included the Plaque Presentations, the Rope Burn, tug-of-war, closing team performances, and the final outcome of a really close Olympics.
